# KINSELLA ON THE DOUBLE

MAN of the match Stephen Kinsella produced a brilliant second half performance as his brace helped his Templeogue united side to an excellent 2-0 victory over Home Farm in this DDSL under 14 encounter in Mobhi Road on Saturday.

It was the away side who began the game the better as they looked to stand up against the ball playing of the home side and they showed great fight as they chased and harried and they created the first chance of the day when Kinsella won the ball back on the edge of the box and played in Conor Davies but his effort was well saved by Eric Donnelly.

Kinsella was again causing havoc minutes later, he picked the ball up on the left hand side and stepped inside his marker before knocking the ball past the last defender and hitting a rasping effort that was brilliantly saved by Donnelly.

Home Farm began to come into the game after this as they looked to get ahead before the break and they had

their first real chance of the day after 25 minutes when Jordan Connell picked the ball up on the left hand side and whipped in an excellent ball that was met by Dylan Grimes but he dragged his effort just wide.

The Farm then had a great chance right on the stroke of halftime and Connell was again involved, this time he cut inside from the left and played a great ball into the path of Shane Heffernan who hit a thumping effort but his effort was excellently saved.

The second half started in much the same vein as the first as the away side seemed to up their game and they began to get the ball down and play some good stuff, the home side were finding it hard to keep in touch with their opponents and it's not often this happens in Mobhi Road.
